Requirements

Mimecast will peer with any networks which are connected to one or more exchange points which we have in common, or directly to any of our points of presence.

We will announce to you via BGP4 only the prefixes assigned to our network, Mimecast SA will not facilitate traffic between autonomous systems other than its own. Mimecast will accept any routes which the peer announces, within reason, ensuring that these prefixes and AS paths are in line with IRR policies for the associated AUT-NUM objects.

Mimecast has the following expectations of peers:

- The peer will only send traffic to our network that is destined for the prefixes we announce to the peer via BGP4.
- The peer will not make use of static routes or default routes directed to our network, or violate any standard operating practice which would limit the availability of our service.
- The peer will not make use of a private ASN.
- IP traffic will be handed off at the closest exit point if more than one peering link is established.
- Each peering party shall bear its own costs in connecting to the peering point or Mimecast POP.
